**Abstract:** The American Society of Civil Engineers (ASCE) was founded in 1852, making it America's oldest national engineering society. Its purpose was/is to advance civil engineering and serve the public good. The Wisconsin Section was initially organized as the Milwaukee Section on March 20, 1923. It held several joint meetings with the Engineers and Scientists of Milwaukee (ESM), and in September 1926, the two groups were formally affiliated. In April 1938, the Milwaukee Section changed its name to the Wisconsin Section. As of 2020, the Wisconsin Section has four branches with approximately 2000 members.

**Scope and Content:** The collection consists of scrapbooks and a binder of clippings detailing street and road construction in the Milwaukee area.
