**Abstract:** Carl Schurz was born in Liblar, Germany, in 1829. He was involved in the failed revolutions of 1848 to unify Germany and fled to the United States in 1852. He came to Wisconsin in 1854 and became a staunch supporter of the anti-slavery movement and the Republican Party. His political career ranged from serving as Secretary of Interior under President Hayes to a U.S. Senator from Missouri to a Minister to Spain. In addition, he fought in the Civil War, rising to the rank of Major General. He passed away in 1906.
