**Abstract:** Fred Vogt was one of eight children of Adolph and Hermine Vogt, immigrants from Schwiebus, Germany. Fred was born January 19, 1884, in Milwaukee. In 1911 he became circulation manager at the *Milwaukee Leader*. In 1914 Vogt and Fred Oberwetter started the Federal Printing Company with Oberwetter serving as president and Fred as secretary-treasurer. He retired in 1951, and the company was dissolved as a result. Vogt also served as director of the Calumet Club for four years and as its president for 1918. He was also president of the Milwaukee Typothetae. He passed away in January 1965.

**Scope and Content:** The collection consists of newspaper clippings, family geneaology, wedding anniversary programs & newspaper, a biography *Milestones in the Life of Fred Vogt*, and other ephemera.
