**Abstract:** Eugene Jerry was a soldier in World War I, stationed at Camp Morrison at the end of the war. The letters begin in November of 1918 and stretch through December of 1918. He writes about his arrival at Camp Morrison, a major embarkation camp, and the murmurings of peace as soldiers' stays at camp are stretched longer and embarkations to France are delayed more and more. Until the Armistice and his honorable discharge the next month, he describes his daily life at the base and his various duties.

**Scope and Content:** This collection consists of letters and a postcard from Eugene Jerry, stationed at Camp Morrison at the end of World War I, to his mother and family in Milwaukee.
