

Title: Wehle, Frederick Wilhelm Papers

Abstract: Wehle was a religious artist and portrait painter. He was born in Germany and immigrated to St. Louis in 1866 before eventually settling in Milwaukee in 1879. His first work was altar paintings for Trinity Lutheran Church in Milwaukee, but he also painted scenes for nearly all the city's Lutheran churches. He passed away in March 1901.

Scope and Content: The collection consists of diaries (original and translations), correspondence, advertisements and a Wehle family genealogy.

Access and Use: No restrictions

Language: German and English
