**Historical Note:** Julius W. Rohn, born in Bohemia in 1827, came to Milwaukee in 1855. The next year he opened a bath house and swimming school on the Milwaukee River above the North Avenue dam. He married Ida Seidemann, also born in Germany. Julius died in 1896. Among their children was Louis Rohn, born in 1862, who worked with his father in the swimming school and continued on with it until it closed in the 1930s.

Louis married Ida Grelke, whose father, Claus, was a sailor. He died about 1870, when Ida and her sister, Anna, were very young. Anna Grelke was the well-known “Tante” Anna, who taught kindergarten in Milwaukee for over 70 years. She died in 1951. Louis and Ida Rohn had several children, among whom was a daughter, Rolyda, born in 1897. She married Douglas M. Miller.

**Abstract:** This collection consists mainly of the papers, photos, memorabilia, game plans, decoration patterns, party books, etc. of Rolyda Miller. For many years she engaged in the business of arranging parties, especially for children.

**Administrative Note:** Rolyda Miller’s daughter, Marilyn (now Sister Mary Leon), donated the collection to the Society. The collection was processed on April 4, 1994 by Janet K. Geronime.
