Abstract: MATC first offered classes in 1912 as the Milwaukee Continuation School. Its makeshift classrooms soon became overcrowded, and a permanent school was built at the corner of 6th and State Streets. The first section of the Main Building opened in 1920, and the new school was called Milwaukee Vocational School to reflect its training mission. The school evolved as technology and workforce needs changed. During World War II, it trained defense workers, and in the post-war period, it offered technical programs to meet the demands from emerging military and television technologies. In 1969, the vocational schools in metropolitan Milwaukee merged into the Milwaukee Area Technical College to offer training to individuals in Milwaukee County and parts of Ozaukee and Washington counties.

Scope and Content: The collection consists of annual reports, course description books, class schedules and other ephemera related to MATC.
