**Historical Note:** In 1928, Eldred and Mildred Dibbert, who lived in California at the time, adopted Roderic Dibbert. In 1931, the family moved to Milwaukee, where Eldred worked with a number of firms in the petroleum industry. Roderic attended public schools in Milwaukee and became very active with St. Andrew’s Episcopal Church. He eventually entered the priesthood and served at a number of parishes across the country.

**Scope and Content:** The records consist of a portion of Roderic Dibbert’s autobiography, obituaries, diaries, clippings, programs, and other material relating to Dibbert and his ancestors—the Burroughs (owners of a trunk-making factory), Williams, and Voeks.
