**Abstract:** Rudolf Hokanson was born in Sweden on Christmas Day in 1879. He immigrated to the U.S. in 1898, first settling in Minnesota before relocating to Milwaukee. He found a job as a chauffeur, which spurred his interest in automobiles. He opened a garage in Portage, Wisconsin, before he and his brother Emil established the Hokanson Auto Company in Madison. He befriended Charles Nash, then president of General Motors, who hired Rudolf as a distributor of Nash automobiles. Hokanson thrived. When he retired in 1932, he sold his automobile business building on N. Broadway for \$450,000. After his business career ended, Rudolph served five times as president of the Milwaukee Association of Commerce and devoted a great deal of time and energy to more than 50 civic organizations. He died in May 1964. He married Choral Huerth in 1906. Choral passed away in May 1963.
