

Title: Reschke, Alfred and Luvella Papers

Abstract: Alfred and Luvella Reschke were both educators in the Milwaukee Public School system. Alfred received his degree from the University of Wisconsin-Madison in 1927 and also served as an assistant with the Sociology Department there. He later taught at North Division High School. Luvella was a teacher and vice-principal at Peckham Jr. High and also principal of Clarke Street School. Both focused on civics/history, and they collaborated on a respected publication, *The Newspaper in the Classroom* (1939). In addition, Luvella was instrumental in formation of the Milwaukee County Junior Historical Society.

Scope and Content: The collection includes correspondence, reports, publications, flyers, and other ephemera detailing the Reschke's efforts with regard to civics education and curriculum development. There are also files related to various Milwaukee and Wisconsin poets.
