Abstract: The Wisconsin Alliance was a socialistic organization formed in 1968 in Madison, eventually establishing chapters in Milwaukee, Green Bay and the Fox River Valley. Its purpose was to promote the idea that working people "should control the political, social, and economic institutions" that affect their lives. It aspired to establish an independent political party that was "more concerned with peoples' needs than with corporate profits." Among other activities, the group supported various labor organizations, assisted small family farms, opposed racism and promoted women's rights. The Milwaukee Chapter was formed in summer 1973. It collaborated with two community organizations: The East Side Housing Action Committee (ESHAC) and the East Side Community Health Organization.

Scope and Content: The collection includes reports, newsletters, minutes, pamphlets/posters regarding not only the Milwaukee Chapter but other state chapters as well.
