Abstract: Erich Stern was born in Milwaukee in 1870 and attended Milwaukee schools before he graduated from Harvard University in 1901. He earned his law degree from Harvard in 1904 and returned to Milwaukee to practice law. He was very involved in the city's civic and cultural life. He served on the common council from 1908-1910 and with the state assembly from 1910-1912 as a member of the progressive wing of the Republican Party, and he taught at Marquette University's Law School for several years. As an art and music lover, he served as treasurer of the Milwaukee Orchestral Association and director of the Milwaukee Art Institute for 18 years.

Scope and Content: The collection includes personal, business and political correspondence.
