Abstract: In October 1956, Reverend William Downey of Fox Point Lutheran announced that an anonymous donation of \$200,000 had been made to help with the care of the aged. This gift sparked the formation of a committee to study how the community can best address the needs of the elderly. The following June the committee recommended a 65-bed home as the initial step in the "United Lutheran Program for the Aging," a nonprofit, faith-based organization advocating for the needs of older adults of all faiths. A fundraising drive made possible the construction of Luther Manor on N. 92nd Street in Wauwatosa, which opened in 1961. While this initial facility has grown over the years, so has the organization's reach to include sponsoring Day Centers in various Milwaukee-area Lutheran churches, hospice care programs, and a health care center, among other programs.

Scope and Content: The collection consists of board of director meeting minutes, correspondence, reports, Luther Manor *News* newsletter and miscellaneous material.
