

Title: Melms, Edmund T. Papers

Abstract: Edmund T. Melms was one of the pioneers of the Socialist Party of America and organizer of the Socialist Party of Milwaukee County. He was instrumental in developing the local party from a few hundred members to nearly five thousand. He served as secretary of the County Central Body for twelve years, was elected for eight years to the board of alderman and acted as president of the aldermanic board during the Seidel administration, 1911-1912. He was elected sheriff of Milwaukee County in 1915-1916 and came within a few thousand votes of being elected congressman in the fourth congressional district of Wisconsin. He was a member of the National Executive committee of the Socialist Party of America and was in charge of 50 local branches in Milwaukee County. He died in 1933.

Scope and Content: The collection consists of correspondence, both personal and relating to Socialist Party issues, Socialist Party books, tracts, and music, as well as material related to Melms' law enforcement activities.
