**Abstract:** Harold W. Stanfield worked for the *Milwaukee Journal* as a photographer, ca. 1940-1960.

**Scope and Content:** The collection consists of publications and clippings, many assumed to be Stanfield's work, and some personal correspondence. The bulk of the collection is photographs by Stanfield, many annotated.

**Access and Use:** No restrictions

**Language:** English

**Notes:** The collection was processed by R. Fuhrman, January 1989, and other material added by Steve Daily, 1996. Many of the photos in the publications and newspaper clippings included in this collection are marked with check marks or "x's." It is assumed that these indicate examples of Stanfield's photography.
