**Abstract:** Angelo Cerminara was born in 1886 in Italy's Calabria region. He came to the U.S. in June 1903, and in 1912, he was the first Italian to graduate from the University of Wisconsin Law School. He came to Milwaukee to work in the office of W.B. Rubin, attorney for the Italian consulate in Wisconsin. In 1916, Cerminara became the Italian consul in Milwaukee, a post he held until 1941. From 1945 until the early 1970s, he served as the consulate's legal counsel. He passed away in December 1975.

**Scope and Content:** The collection includes correspondence, clippings, and newspapers related to the annual Columbus Day celebration and to the Spanish Civil War.
