Abstract: In 1913 Milwaukee obtained through the enactment of a law the creation of a Sewerage Commission that was charged with the duty of collecting, transmitting, and disposing of sewage. In 1921 a law was enacted creating a metropolitan drainage district and the Metropolitan Sewerage Commission of the County of Milwaukee. By 1959, the laws were changed to enlarge the Metropolitan District to include all of Milwaukee County and provide service to drainage areas tributary to the Metropolitan district.

Scope and Content: The collection consists of annual and miscellaneous reports, meeting minutes and legal proceedings.
