

Title: Milwaukee Clipper Collection

Abstract: The Milwaukee Clipper was a passenger/auto ferry that operated between Milwaukee and Muskegon, Michigan, from 1941 to 1970. She was built in 1905 and originally called the Juniata. She served as a Great Lakes passenger ship until she was retired from service in 1937. Max and Mark McKee of Muskegon purchased the Juniata for cross-lake service and renamed it the Milwaukee Clipper in 1941. After its last cross lake run, the ship was sold in 1977 and became a floating museum/convention facility. It was designated a National Historic Landmark in 1989. The ship was purchased by the Great Lakes Clipper Preservation in 1997 and returned to Muskegon.

Scope and Content: The collection consists of schedules, a placemat, and a photocopy of an article from the December 1990 issue of *Historic Preservation*.
