**Abstract:** This collection contains the personal papers of the Bohle family, spanning three generations. The family founder, Andreas Bohle immigrated from Germany in the 1870's and built the family home on the South Side at what is now 1586 S. Muskego Ave. His son, Gottfried worked for Pfister and Vogel as an apprentice hand buffer and was employed there for 35 years. Gottfried's children, Arthur, Albert and Margarete were born around the turn of the century. Albert died in his twenties, while Arthur served in the Pacific during World War II. The lone daughter, Maragrete, never married and taught at Henry W. Longfellow School of MPS. She resided in the same residence on S. Muskego St. after her parents died in the 1950's, and further still until her own death in 2005.
