Abstract: Edgar Tallmadge was a professional photographer who worked in Milwaukee prior to relocating his business to Waukesha in the late 1910's (1917 or 1918). Tallmadge invented and patented a camera back. He was also active in professional photographers' organizations.

Scope and Content: The collection consists of correspondence and patent-related material to his camera back invention. Also included are membership certificates and convention cards related to the Wisconsin Professional Photographers Association/Photographers Association of America. In addition, there is a photo album of Newton Stewart's summer home "Pukwana."
