Abstract: The Mitchell Family was undoubtedly one of Milwaukee's most influential clans. Alexander Mitchell started it all. He was born in Scotland and relocated to Milwaukee in 1839. He quickly became one of the city's financial giants, acting as president of the Wisconsin Marine and Fire Insurance Company, the Chicago, Milwaukee & St. Paul Railroad, and Northwestern National Insurance. His only son, John Lendrum Mitchell, also contributed to Milwaukee history. He served with distinction during the Civil War but had to resign due to failing eyesight. He turned his attention to agricultural pursuits and established a large estate called "Meadowmere." Agriculture was not his only interest, however. He was also a scholar, a patron of the arts and a public servant, serving as a State Senator, U.S. Representative and U.S. Senator. He and his second wife, Harriet Danforth Becker, had seven children. Their oldest son, William, achieved the most fame among his siblings. He enlisted during the Spanish-American War and also served with honor during World War I, achieving the rank of Brigadier General. He was an early proponent of the military use of air power, but his criticism of military leaders led to his much-publicized court martial in 1925.

Scope and Content: The collection consists of correspondence, biographical information, reports, books, articles, newspaper clippings, photos, scrapbooks, and other ephemera. They include information on Alexander Mitchell, John Lendrum Mitchell, his wife Harriet Danforth Becker Mitchell, and several of their children.
