Abstract: Lee Wells Millard was born in Montrose, Michigan, in 1876. He held a variety of jobs in Michigan before relocating to Milwaukee in 1903. He was a stutterer for more than 20 years before he developed a "Natural Method for Correction" and wanted to share his discovery with others who stammered. With the assistance of his brother Dr. Frank Millard, who was practicing in Milwaukee, Lee established the Millard Institute for Normal Speech (also called the Northwestern School for Stammerers). The school occupied quarters on Grand Avenue and First Street. It was so successful that Millard moved the school in 1914 to larger quarters at 2316 Grand Avenue (now 2316 W. Wisconsin). Lee passed away in 1943.
