

Title: Goll, Julius Collection

Abstract: Julius Goll was born in Wittenburg, Germany, in 1823. He immigrated to the U.S. in 1848 and moved to Milwaukee a year later. He and Henry Stern opened a small dry goods business in 1850, and the company name was changed to Goll and Frank in 1852. Some years later, the firm established a prosperous wholesale dry goods business. Goll passed away in January 1896.

Scope and Content: The collection consists of Goll's biography and obituary as well as a brief typescript history of Wisconsin, correspondence (largely in German), legal papers, a book about the Goll & Frank store belonging to Josephine Elizabeth Goll and a booklet on appraisal by Fred T. Goll.
