Abstract: Minnie Grimm was born and raised in Wautoma, Wisconsin. She graduated from the Waushara County Training School in 1916. She and Edgar F. Stein were married 1927. For several years, Edgar served as president of Stein-Baither, Inc., a dealer of Nash automobiles. By 1933, however, he was working as a salesman for the Nash Frint Motor Company. The following year, he established the Stein Motor Company, which continued operating until 1956. Their daughter, Nina, attended the Medill School of Journalism at Northwestern University and wrote a number of travelogue articles for the *Whitefish Bay Herald*.

Scope and Content: The collection consists of Stein household expense ledgers, as well as bills, receipts and other miscellaneous household records from the 1930s. Also included are sheet music, instructional booklets and other miscellaneous material belonging to Nina Marie Stein (Edgar's and Minnie's daughter). In addition, there is material belonging to Nina C. Grimm (Slater) [Minnie's sister?].
