

Title: Lubar, Samuel Collection

Abstract: Samuel Lubar lived with his family at 2952 N. 55th Street for more than thirty years. He worked as a salesman for the Wisconsin Liquor Company.

Scope and Content: The collection consists primarily of 61 newspaper clipping scrapbooks, with selected periodical clippings, covering the period 1940-1960. The first 24 books deal almost entirely with World War II and include information on specific battles, campaigns, peace conferences and post-war planning, including the United Nations. Volumes 25 through 31 cover the years 1946-1953 and include topics such as the continuing development of atomic weapons, the post-war division and tension in Europe and the Korean War. Volumes 31 through 61 cover the years 1954-1960 and deal almost exclusively with the Cold War. Specific topics include American-Soviet relations in general, the Soviet invasion of Hungary and the Suez crisis of 1956, the Space race, and the overall foreign policy of the Eisenhower administration.

The books have a national and international scope and not a Milwaukee focus. The bulk of the clippings are from *The Milwaukee Journal*, the *Milwaukee Sentinel*, *The New York Times*, the *Chicago Daily News*, and the *Chicago Daily Tribune*. Chief among the periodicals represented are *Time* and *Life* magazines.
