

**Title:** Marion Andrews Concert Bureau Collection

**Abstract:** In 1914, the A Capella Chorus – with George H. Moeller as president and G.E.G. Kuechle as treasurer – launched an effort to attract prominent musical acts to Milwaukee. About three years later, Moeller and Kuechle left the chorus, resulting in the formation of the Moeller-Andrews Concert Bureau. After Moeller's death, Marion Andrews and Kuechle organized the Marion Andrews Concert Bureau around 1919 to continue booking top-notch musical talent. Among its many successes, the bureau brought Enrico Caruso, Ignacy Paderewski and Sergei Rachmaninoff to Milwaukee and sponsored the Chicago Opera Association's annual visits.

**Scope and Content:** The collection consists of four issues of *The Concert News*, the bureau's official bulletin. The issues list and describe of musical events around Milwaukee.
