**Abstract:** Milwaukee County's Juvenile Court was established in 1901. It reflected the growing interest in childhood as a stage of development and the move to provide distinct institutions for "delinquent, dependent or neglected" children under the age of 16. In addition to its legal function, the court operated as a social service agency. In 1949, it was renamed the Children's Court. The State Legislature revised the Children's Code in 1977 so that the court's disciplinary function became secondary to its role as a social service agency.
