**Abstract:** Lyman J. "Tangle" McCraken was born in Rochester, New York in the late 1820s. In 1845, he moved to Milwaukee and eventually became a partner in Green and McCraken, the city's principal dealer in fish and oysters. During the Soldiers' Home Fair in 1865, McCraken gained notoriety as the head of "Tangle's Feature of the Fair," a sideshow that featured attractions such as a 145-year-old "world's oldest man" and a red, white, and blue poodle. McCraken lived in poverty in his later years and would die in 1897.

**Scope and Content:** Collection consists of ephemera related to Green and McCraken, bank notes, memos, miscellaneous programs from the post-Civil War era, a notebook of poems and other writings from his sister Mariette McCraken Langworthy written in the 1830s, as well as a memorial pamphlet for her funeral service in 1897. Oversize items include a certificate of membership in Engine Co. No. 5 for A. McCraken and a lease between Byron Kilbourn and Austin McCraken. A scrapbook of articles written by McCraken from the 1860s and 1870s is found in the Lapham Case.
