

**Title:** Schragger Auction Galleries, Inc.

**Abstract:** Adolph “Al” Jack Schragger was born in Milwaukee, the second of eight children of Samuel and Sara Schragger. In 1936, at age 18, he began working in the auction business as an apprentice for J.C. Wall & Son on N. Broadway. Four years later, he partnered with Freda Blumberg to open an antique store, the Victorian Shop, on N. 12th St. He served in the Pacific Theater during World War II, and after the war he returned to the auction business. In 1946, he founded Milwaukee Auction Galleries, which he operated until he sold the business in 1973 and moved to California. He continued auctioning in California, but he returned to Milwaukee after he received several requests to auction various estates. In 1985, he opened Schragger Auction Galleries in the former Third Church of Christian Science at 2915 N. Sherman Boulevard. He maintained the auction house until 2010, when he held his final auction in May. Throughout his decades in the auction business, Schragger was well respected because of his honesty and fairness. He passed away in September 2013.

**Scope and Content:** The collection consists primarily of auction catalogs that span Schragger’s work with Milwaukee Auction Galleries and Schragger Auction Galleries. Also included are auction notices and flyers, newspaper clippings and miscellaneous promotional booklets.
