Abstract: George William Fox came from a long line of distinguished Wisconsin physicians. He was born in Milwaukee, but the family moved to Madison after his father died in 1920. He graduated from Madison Central High School in 1923 and then studied at the University of Wisconsin, where he participated in track and field. He went on to graduate from Rush Medical College in 1931. He worked as company surgeon for the Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul & Pacific Railroad, International Harvester, and the Chicago & North Western Railway Company. He also served on the staffs of Milwaukee Hospital and Milwaukee Children's Hospital. He enlisted in the Navy on August 17, 1942 and served with the medical staff aboard the aircraft carrier *USS Franklin*. He was killed on March 19, 1945, when the *Franklin* was attacked by Japanese dive bombers. He died while tending to wounded personnel.

Scope and Content: The collection consists of newspaper clippings, photos, correspondence, publications, and other ephemera primarily pertaining to the *USS Franklin* and Fox's military service and death. Also included is material related to other members of the Fox and Fitzhugh families.
