**Historical Note:** Pauline Eugena Stanwitt was the longest tenured teacher in the Milwaukee Public Schools system. Her 55 years of service, most of which were served at Pulaski High School was dedicated to being a guidance counselor to assist student attempting to get into college. Her collection consists of the numerous accolades and awards that she received during her career.

**Scope and Content:** The collection includes award recommendation and acceptance correspondence make up a majority of the documentation. Framed awards, books, and Ms. Stanwitt's academic degrees make up the rest of the collection.
