Abstract: Bank One merged with the Marine Corporation and its subsidiary banks in 1988. The Marine Corporation was a holding company organized in 1958, and its roots stretch back to the very beginning of banking in Milwaukee. Through various mergers, the Marine Corporation can trace its history through the Wisconsin Marine & Fire Insurance Co. Bank, the Marine National Bank, the Bank of Milwaukee, the National Exchange Bank, and the Marine National Exchange Bank.

Scope and Content: The records consist of histories, clippings, photos, ledgers, biographical data, reports, correspondence, and other ephemera that help document the history of the various components that eventually became part of the Bank One Corporation.
