

Title: Calvary Presbyterian Church Collection

Abstract: In 1869, Presbyterians situated on the west side of the Milwaukee River wanted to established their own place of worship. Consequently, they hired prominent architects Henry Koch and Julius Hess to design the new Victorian Gothic-style church. Calvary Presbyterian opened in 1872. As the size of the congregation steadily dwindled in the late 20th/early 21st centuries, the church adapted to host, as of 2017, weddings, art and dance groups, a theater company and congregations of other faiths.

Scope and Content: The collection consists of meeting minutes of various organizations within the church, histories, bulletins and other ephemera.

Language: English

Notes: Multiple donors have contributed to this collection. It was removed from the Church Collection in November 2010 to form this manuscript collection.
