**Scope and Content:** The Dickinson Family lineage can be traced back to Norway and Yorkshire. Some of the descents of the Dickinson Family resided in the city of Milwaukee. For example, Dr. George Dickinson practiced medicine in the city of Milwaukee. Furthermore, Jay Dickinson fought during the civil war and was taken prisoner at Munfordville, Kentucky, by the Confederate Army. The collection includes the following items: civil war parole documents for Jay Dickinson, 11<sup>th</sup> regiment Michigan (1862), genealogical papers of Thomas Dickinson and John Dinsmore families (1895), published critical comments on genealogy done by Fredrick Dickinson of Chicago in 1897, and newspaper obituaries from 1903.
