**Abstract:** Milwaukee Smith Hockelberg, born October 11, 1835, was the first white child born in Milwaukee. Her father, Uriel Smith, and mother came to Milwaukee in spring 1835, and he established a tailoring business. Milwaukee attended the community's rudimentary schools and eventually moved to California in 1873 and married Bernhard Hockelberg, a miner. The couple had one child. Milwaukee suffered a stroke and died in 1908.

**Scope and Content:** The collection consists of several copies of a memorial address concerning Mrs. Hockelberg given by Charles Milwaukee Sivyer to the Old Settlers Club of Milwaukee; a newspaper article about Milwaukee and Charles Sivyer; and Mrs. Hockelberg's autograph book, 1889-1903.
