

Title: Lord's Day Alliance Collection

Abstract: The Wisconsin Sabbath Association was organized in December 1885 with the purpose of promoting “in every legitimate way, the regard for, and the observance of the Lord’s Day, by all classes of people...” In November 1895, the organization’s name was changed to the Wisconsin Sunday Rest Day Association. In 1919, the Lord’s Day Alliance of Wisconsin was organized to “defend and preserve the Lord’s Day as a day of rest and worship, to secure one day of rest in seven for all the toiling masses” and to work for the enforcement of Sunday laws.

Scope and Content: The collection consists of minute books, secretary’s books, and publications from five organizations that promoted observance of the Sabbath or temperance.
