**Abstract:** The Wisconsin State Federation of Labor was formed in 1893 and became the largest federation of labor unions in Wisconsin. Affiliated with the American Federation of Labor, its purpose was to “agitate, organize, federate and educate the workers of the state and secure for them absolute social and economic independence.” In 1958, it merged with the CIO-affiliated Wisconsin State Industrial Council to form the Wisconsin AFL-CIO.

**Scope and Content:** The collection consists of convention programs and proceedings, *Legislative Record* publication, and a legal brief.
