Historical Note: Lauer served with the 32nd Division in World War I and later served as historian for the 32nd Veterans' Association. During World War II, he worked as a public relations officer with the Milwaukee Ordnance Plant. As a civilian, Lauer operated his own real estate business.

Scope and Content: The records consist of scrapbooks, clippings, newsletters, correspondence, publications, appraisal records and other ephemera that help detail the 32nd Division during World War I and II, Lauer's work with various veterans groups and his real estate business.
