**Abstract:** The Milwaukee Bucks are the city's team in the National Basketball Association (NBA). The franchise's inaugural season was 1968/69, finishing in last place in the Eastern Division. The Bucks won a coin flip with the Phoenix Suns after the 1968/69 season, which enabled the team to draft center Lew Alcindor (later Kareem Abdul-Jabbar) from UCLA. Alcindor led the Bucks to its only NBA title for the 1970/71 season.

**Scope and Content:** The collection consists of media guides, game programs, yearbooks and other ephemera.
