Abstract: The city service commission was established in 1895 to administer Milwaukee's personnel system in accordance with a law passed by the state legislature. Originally, the commission conducted competitive examinations for positions in the city's classified service. The law was repealed and replaced in 1919 by a state civil service law which made provisions for a merit-based system.

Scope and Content: The collection consists of annual/miscellaneous reports and manuals.
