Abstract: Daniel W. (Niel) Norris' interest in improving the life of disadvantaged boys began when he was appointed a probation officer in 1911. With the encouragement of his mother Fannie Wells Norris, Niel established the Mount Vernon Boys Camp in 1917 in Waukesha County. That same year, Norris purchased the Orchard View Farm near Muskego to expand the size of the camp and continued acquiring land for several years. Eventually, the facilities at the Norris Farm included farm outbuildings, dormitories, a school, gymnasium and various sporting courts/fields. The Norris Foundation was organized in 1927 as a trusteeship and reorganized as a charitable organization in 1935. The organization evolved into the Norris Adolescent Center, which continues to offer a "therapeutic, educational, and caring environment for adolescents who are experiencing problems."

**Scope and Content:** The collection consists of Norris Foundation newsletters, anniversary histories and miscellaneous publications.
