Historical Note: William F. Rasche was a long-time teacher, principal, and director of the Milwaukee Vocational and Adult School (now Milwaukee Area Technical College). He was born in Milwaukee on June 6, 1888. He began his teaching career in South Dakota from 1907 to 1913. He returned to Milwaukee and became director of the Cudahy Vocational School in 1916. In 1922, he became a teacher at the Milwaukee Vocational School. From 1926 to 1930, he left Milwaukee to serve as a Professor of Vocational Education at the University of Pittsburgh and as personnel director for General Motors. He returned to the Milwaukee Vocational School in 1930 as assistant director. In 1940, he was named director, and he held that post until he retired in 1958.

During his stint as director, Rasche was instrumental in the establishment of an educational television station (WMVS-Channel 10) at the vocational school. In addition to his educational work, Rasche was one of Milwaukee's most civic-minded citizens. He belonged to numerous groups and was one of the leading forces for the establishment of the War Memorial and the Performing Arts Center and was a supporter of equal rights for Milwaukee's African-American community. But Rasche focused his efforts on behalf of Milwaukee's youth, serving many years on the Metropolitan Youth Commission. Rasche passed away in March 1970 of a heart attack.

Scope and Content: The records consist of correspondence, reports, minutes, clippings, publications, and photographs. They detail Rasche's career in vocational education, as well as his efforts to establish an educational television station, and his many civic activities. There is also some personal material with records pertaining to Rasche's family.
