Abstract: Joseph Ryan was born in Milwaukee on July 15, 1895. He graduated from Marquette University High School in 1911 and attended Marquette University Night Law School, 1912-1913. He began his long career with Allis-Chalmers in 1915. He worked as an accountant and auditor and eventually became assistant secretary/treasurer in 1933, a position he held until his death in October 1956. Ryan was extremely active with the Wisconsin Republican Party as well as several civic, educational, and philanthropic organizations.

Scope and Content: The collection consists of miscellaneous awards/citations and three scrapbooks of photos, newspaper clippings, correspondence, citations/awards, and other ephemera detailing his involvement with various organizations and campaigns, such as Marquette University, the Navy League, the Community Fund, Eagles Club, and Junior Achievement.
