Abstract: The Steuben Society of America was one of several patriotic fraternal organizations formed after World War I. It was made up of German Americans who were loyal to the United States, and its purpose was to “stimulate among American citizens an active interest in their government.” Muehlenberg Unit No. 36 was Milwaukee’s local chapter. Its clubhouse was located at 2924 W. North Avenue.

Scope and Content: The collection consists of correspondence, financial reports and papers, annual banquet programs, newsletters, a speech by Gustav Schmitt at the unveiling of the Baron Von Steuben statue, commemorative booklets at unveiling of Steuben statue, pamphlets, booklets, introduction and installation of officers, newspaper clippings and other ephemera.
