Historical Note: In 1880, master craftsman Bernard Trepte founded Globe Wire & Iron Works in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. Originally the company manufactured products such as wire goods, bank grills, and ornamental fences. In 1905, the firm was incorporated and expanded its product line to include park benches, steel stairs, and the elevator car. As the need for elevators increased, the company began to specialize in that line of work. During the Great Depression, as other businesses were failing, the company acquired the assets of another well-known manufacturer of elevator cars, The Van Doorn Company of Quincey, Illinois. A drought in high-rise office construction prompted Globe – Van Doorn to close its doors in 1993 after 113 years as a leader in the elevator industry.
