**Abstract:** Prior to 1931, much of Milwaukee's amateur was offered through social centers under the auspices of the Municipal Department of Recreation and Adult Education. Each year the social centers staged a drama festival. On June 24, 1931, Dorothy Enderis from the Department of Recreation announced a plan to establish a more advanced theatrical group, known as the Milwaukee Players, made up of the best actors and actresses from the various social centers. Eleven individuals comprised the Players the first year. The number grew to 60 the following year. During its existence, the Milwaukee Players have staged numerous productions, including Shakespearean plays, musicals, dramas, and children's plays.

**Scope and Content:** The collection consists of photos, programs, playbills, a history of the group, newspaper clippings, audio recordings, and three scrapbooks and two envelopes containing clippings, programs, and photos.
