**Historical Note:** This collection contains various documents associated with the Chicago, Milwaukee, and St. Paul Railway (a.k.a. The Milwaukee Road). It was chartered in 1847 as the Milwaukee & Waukesha Railroad. The railway was later organized on May 5, 1863, as the Milwaukee & St. Paul Railway Company. On February 11, 1874, its name was changed to the Chicago, Milwaukee, & St. Paul Railway.

Administrative Note: The collection was processed on June 29, 1993, by Jeewon K. Schally. Material was added in 1995 and 1996 and was processed by Janet Geronime.
