Abstract: The Old Settlers Club was organized in 1869 with the goal of preserving documents, photographs, and artifacts related to Milwaukee's early history. When the club was dissolved at the end of the 1940's, its collections were donated to the Milwaukee County Historical Society.

Scope and Content: The collection consists of books, speeches, histories, and financial records of the Old Settlers Club.
