Abstract: As early as 1971, the Milwaukee County Historical Society (MCHS) and representatives of the history departments at Marquette University and University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee met informally to begin planning for the county's observance of the U.S. Bicentennial in 1976. The following year, Milwaukee County Executive John Doyne requested MCHS to submit recommendations regarding how the county should celebrate the Bicentennial. The resulting program was a collaborative effort by multiple organizations and included exhibits, published histories, historic markers, architectural surveys, lectures, parades and pageants.

Scope and Content: The collection consists of correspondence, photographs, brochures and related materials.
