Abstract: The first Milwaukee Courthouse was built in 1836 on the north half of Courthouse square which was bounded by Oneida Street (now E. Wells), Biddle Street (now E. Kilbourn), Jackson, and Jefferson Streets. The first Courthouse was razed and the second Courthouse was erected on the same site. Building of the second Courthouse commenced in 1870 and was completed in 1873. Construction of the third and present Courthouse began in 1929 and ended in 1931 except for remodeling. This Courthouse sits on property bounded by Ninth, Tenth, Wells, and State Street.

Scope and Content: The collection contains pamphlets, memorandums, drawings, specifications, reports and other ephemera related to all three of Milwaukee's courthouses.

Access and Use: No restrictions

Language: English

Notes: The collection was processed by Steve Daily, September 11, 1993, and added to by Kevin Abing on August 28, 1999.

Original newspapers and books that were placed in a lead box in the second Milwaukee County Courthouse in 1870 and were turned over to MCHS by Lawrence J. Timmerman, Chairman of County Board. A portion of these materials, which previously comprised box 3 of this collection, were deaccessioned in 2025 due to their extremely poor physical condition and lack of unique value. Those materials are listed, as best could be identified, at the end of this finding aid.
